## STRIKE: NEW DISPUTE

**T**HE Bakers, Confectioners and Allied Workers' Union to-day protested to the Amalgamated Transport and General Workers' Union about labourers continuing to produce bread in Inglis & Co., Ltd., where operative bakers are on strike.

About 300 bakers and apprentices are involved in the stoppage which is affecting the Eliza Street works and four subsidiaries of Inglis's in Belfast.

Mr. James Morgan, secretary of the Bakers' Union, said the action of the labourers in accepting work and assisting in the manufacture of bakery goods was against all recognised trade union practice.

He appealed to the Transport Union to assist his members "in their struggle against unjustified redundancy."

The bakers withdrew their labour because the company would not replace one of their members who had been dismissed in the Eliza Street works.

Mr. Morgan said there was no sign of any negotiations.

The strike is not causing any shortage of bread as Inglis are still producing in their Eliza Street premises and other bakeries in the city have been told by the union that they can increase output.
